Dear Director:

At approximately 1400 hours on Monday, June 1, 1981, the body of the victim, Linda M. O'Day, white female, 28 years of age, of 129 East Third Street, New Castle, Delaware, was discovered on the bedroom floor of her residence. Her nightgown was bunched up around her neck and the position of her body, spreadeagled, suggests that she was sexually assaulted. An autopsy was performed by the Medical Examiner's Office, Wilmington, Delaware, on Tuesday, June 2, 1981. The cause of death was a stab wound to the left side of the chest which passed through the heart and liver. In addition, the victim had been manually strangled and had received four (4) other minor stab wounds.

Details of the victim's movements are sketchy at this time. She was last seen alive on Saturday, May 30, 1981, at approximately 1400 hours.

- 2 - Whether or not A-5 through A-7 are of sufficient quality for comparison, and if so, can they be compared with A-1, A-2, and E-49 through E-52.
- 3 - Whether or not A-3 and A-4 contain any foreign particles, blood, and/or residues suitable for identification.
- 4 - Whether or not A-8 is of sufficient quality and quantity, and if so, can it be identified to its furthest extent.
- 5 - Whether or not A-9 and A-10 contain any foreign particles and/or hairs, and if so, can they be compared with A-1, A-2, and E-49 through E-52.
- 6 - Whether or not residues on A-11 and A-12 are of sufficient quality for comparison, and if so, can it be compared with A-8.
- 7 - Whether or not the blade area of A-12, B-16, B-17, B-20, and item B-30, contain any latent impressions of value.

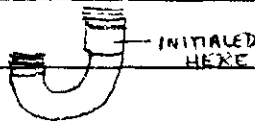

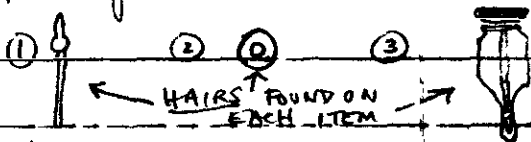

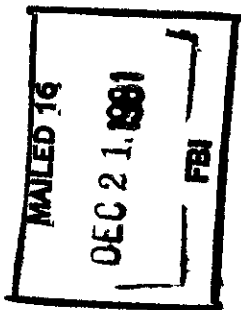

Requested profile in captioned case was held in abeyance for several months pending receipt of preliminary profile being prepared by Baltimore Division Profiling Coordinator. In August, 1983 it was learned that a preliminary profile was not being prepared by the Profiling Coordinator.

After review and analysis of submitted material, on 10/7/83 SSA [redacted] Behavioral Science Unit (telephonically contacted Det. [redacted] Delaware State Police, concerning problems in profiling captioned case. It was explained to Det. [redacted] that because this case involved a "mixed" crime scene it was difficult to profile. In addition, material initially forwarded to the Behavioral Science Unit did not include autopsy photographs or photographs of the victim's neck and face. Det. [redacted] requested that he come to the FBI Academy to discuss this case and provide additional information.

On 11/21/83, Evidence Technician [redacted] and Det. [redacted] of the Delaware State Police met with SSA [redacted] at the FBI Academy, Quantico, Virginia. During the meeting several investigative questions were discussed including the sloppy housekeeping of the victim, the source of acid phosphatase present in the victim's mouth and vagina, and whether victim's hyoid bone was fractured.

SSA [redacted] explained to the officers that captioned crime is extremely difficult to profile because the behavioral evidence examined in developing a profile is mixed. The crime scene is generally sloppy, but the subject cleaned up some areas.

A weapon of opportunity was used and left behind, but semen was apparently found in the vagina. The victim's face was apparently deliberately covered, but her vagina was left exposed. There was no forced entry to the victim's residence, but the door was left open by the subject. All these factors represent behavioral inconsistencies and make development of a profile difficult.

b7C SSA [] discussed with the officers several possible explanations for the inconsistencies. The subject may have been young; the subject may have been on drugs; the subject may have been mentally ill or psychotic; the crime scene may have been deliberately staged to confuse police investigation; or there may have been more than one subject. At this point the officers advised that HENRY LEE LUCAS, an admitted serial killer in jail in Texas, had confessed to this murder. The remainder of the discussion then focused on evaluating LUCAS and several of the victim's friends and acquaintances as possible suspects in this murder. Post offense behavior and pro-active techniques were also discussed.

In view of the above, no official profile was prepared or is being submitted.

Enclosed for the Behavioral Science Unit is the case report of the Delaware State Police concerning captioned homicide. It is requested that Psychological Profile be done.

For information, Detective [redacted] and Evidence Technician [redacted] are of the opinion that the crime scene and victim in this case were "cleaned up" after the crime. Little, if any, blood was found on the floor around the victim, however, there was blood on the floor under the victim presenting the appearance that the area was cleaned but the victim not moved. Preliminary tests done on the scene were positive for blood in the bathroom sink, however, this test is of limited reliability as positive reaction occurs with such other items as make-up, etc. Sink "J" trap (plumbing) as well as other items found at the scene were sent to FBI Laboratory but were found negative for blood. b7C

Presence of what appears to be vomit at either side of bed is still unexplained. Also unexplained is the presence of three additional steak knives in addition to the one found in the body.

Members of the Delaware State Police as well as the Psychological Profiling Coordinator of the Baltimore Division are available to travel to Quantico for "oral profile" if necessary or desired by the Behavioral Science Unit.

[redacted] currently incarcerated in the Williamson County Jail, Georgetown, Texas was advised of the identity of the interviewing agent as well as the nature of the interview. [redacted] was advised of his constitutional rights as set forth on the Interrogation: Advice of Rights form, and advised that he would be willing to speak to the interviewing agent without a lawyer present and that he understood his rights.

[redacted] advised that he first became acquainted with a cult known as the "Hands of Death" when he was about sixteen or seventeen years old and living in Jacksonville, Florida, prior to the time he ever met HENRY LEE LUCAS. [redacted] explained that he had been involved in using various types of narcotics and drinking alcohol and associating with similar individuals when he met an older man named [redacted] Last Name Unknown (LNU), a white male approximately forty years old. [redacted] stated the he does not know what occupation [redacted] had at the time nor anything else about him and he has not seen him for many years. [redacted] explained that he is now thirty-seven years old and this took place about twenty years ago.

[redacted] stated that [redacted] told him that he believed in witchcraft, Buddha's and spirits of the devil and that there was a cult of individuals who believed similarly. [redacted] stated that one night [redacted] agreed to take him to a meeting of the cult, known as the "Hands of Death". [redacted] stated that [redacted] drove him approximately five or six hours south of Jacksonville and at one point tied cloth around his eyes so that he would not see where he was going. [redacted] stated that [redacted] wore a sheet or gown that had two eyes holes and a mouth hole cut out for the head area and over the top of his head he strapped two cow's horns. [redacted] observed what appeared to be a large altar that had a cloth spread over it and many swords, machetes, butcher knives, hatchets and axes around it. [redacted] added that there was a large cross with some type of hands at the bottom. [redacted] explained that at subsequent meetings the hands he observed were carved out of wood on some occasions and other occasions they would be glass or actual skelton's hands. [redacted] told [redacted] that he would have to participate in the ceremony and that they were going to take someone's life so that the devil would have more spirits. b7C

[redacted] advised that about this time a young white female walked up to the altar and stripped off all of her clothing and laid down on the altar. [redacted] observed several people with hypodermic needles shooting an unknown chemical into her arms two or three times and he thought the girl looked as though she was under the influence of some sort of drug. [redacted] stated that an individual (he could not say whether it was a man or a woman) wearing a hood over their head took a machete and cut the girl's throat wide open. [redacted] also observed that there was a calf there and that the calf's throat was cut about the same time. Others caught the woman's blood pouring from her throat in a pan that they put next to her neck and the calf's blood was caught in a different pan. [redacted] stated that the individual that had killed the girl rubbed the calf's blood and her own blood over her body with his hands and [redacted] was told that he would have to drink the blood of both the calf and the girl. [redacted] hesitated and he was told that he would have to do it in a hurry before it clotted so he did so. [redacted] added that several men got on the altar and had intercourse with the girl's body including [redacted] himself and others had intercourse with the dead calf. b7C

[redacted] stated that the people next pulled the cloth out from underneath the girl and he observed that there was a iron grate underneath it. Logs and other bits of wood were put under the iron grate and it was all set afire in order to burn the body of the girl as well as the calf's body which had been put next to the girl. b7C

several mutilating the girl's body, cutting her with knives. [REDACTED] stated that he ate what he thought were barbeque ribs and was told afterwards that he had eaten the girl's ribs. [REDACTED] stated that there was a lot of drinking, smoking of marijuana and individuals taking some unknown pills.

[REDACTED] estimated that there were approximately 100 people present at the ceremony and numerous air boats in which they had arrived. After a time, the individuals started getting into their air boats to leave and [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that while he was not a full member, he was considered to be a member of the cult.

[REDACTED] related that sometime during his first years as a member he was taken through a sort of training course where he was taught how to shoot various weapons, use butcher knives and axes and how to beat a person to death. [REDACTED] stated that the training lasted five or six weeks and took place in a remote area of the Florida Everglades. [REDACTED] stated that the training also included instruction in climbing building rainspouts and entering locked houses. [REDACTED] added that he still does not know why he was taught to climb buildings. He recalls that there were about twelve people in his training group comprised of both men and women. [REDACTED] added that after he completed his training he had to train others. The last time he did so was several years ago.

After this, [REDACTED] advised that once or twice a month he would get a mysterious postcard at his home in Jacksonville, Florida which would state, "Meet me at...on...". [REDACTED] stated that a place and a date and time would be filled in and it would frequently be some place like a restaurant or a truck stop. [REDACTED] explained that he does not read very well so he would have someone else read the post card for him. [REDACTED] stated that this was frequently one of the drunks he would pick up in the Jacksonville area. Once [REDACTED] arrived at the meeting place, someone would meet him and take him to a remote location for a repeat of the ceremony described above. [REDACTED] stated that sometimes the locations were old cemeteries, graveyards and sometimes all in the Everglades. [REDACTED] stated that he could not tell if he ever went back to the location of the first meeting since it was dark and he was not sure where he was. [REDACTED] advised that this pattern continued up until he was jailed on June 6, 1983; however, on occasion there would be a two or three month gap between the ceremonies. [REDACTED] related that these ceremonies took place in nearly all of the states of the union but he cannot recall any specific locations. The last

meeting that he attended was in Arizona approximately two to three months prior to his jailing in June, 1983. [redacted] stated that he received a postcard at his home address, [redacted] Jacksonville, Florida which told him to meet someone at an unrecalled location in Arizona on a specific date and at a specific time. [redacted] stated that he drove his car to Arizona and attended a ceremony such as the one described above in a very remote location, possibly in the desert but near enough that he could see mountains. b7C

[redacted] advised that after he had been a member for a time, he was told that it was his turn to kill and he obliged by chopping off the head of a girl that was sacrificed at this particular meeting. b7C [redacted] stated that he had intercourse with the body and then drank her blood. [redacted] added that at one meeting he asked those present if he could use a gun instead of a knife to kill the victim and someone produced a pistol after which he shot the female victim point blank in the head. [redacted] stated that females were not the only victims and sometimes men were used as victims. [redacted] stated that he was told that he could never drop out of the cult once he was a member and the victims were individuals who had tried to drop out. [redacted] stated that he went alone to the last meeting in Arizona and that he did not meet HENRY LEE LUCAS through the cult. [redacted] stated that he took LUCAS to a meeting years ago (exact time period unrecalled) but [redacted] related several times that he thought that LUCAS was a member of the cult before [redacted] was although LUCAS never said so. At first, [redacted] did not recall ever being picked up by an individual while hitchhiking with LUCAS after which the individual giving them a ride told them about the cult. Later, [redacted] said that he does remember being picked up by some individual who talked to him and LUCAS about the cult but that he was already a member of the cult when this occurred. He could not recall the time period that he and LUCAS were picked up and told about the cult by this unknown individual. [redacted] could not recall where this incident took place. b7C

[redacted] stated that LUCAS has a tattoo of a cross with hands at the base and flames of fire in the web of his right hand and that this is a sign of the members of the Hands of Death. When asked why he did not have such a tattoo, [redacted] stated only that he just never got one but that he wore a ring with a devil's head on it as did some of the members of the cult. [redacted] related that the first meeting of the cult that he took LUCAS to was held in the Everglades and LUCAS did not state that he was previously aware of the cult during this ceremony.

[redacted] was asked how he would recognize the individual that was to pick him up at his meeting place and take him to the ceremonies. [redacted] replied that he "reckoned that they just kept up with where you were at". When pressed, [redacted] replied that the postcards told him to sit in a certain place and that was how the other member could recognize him. When pressed further, [redacted] stated that the person meeting him would give the password "Hands". This would confirm to [redacted] that they were member of the cult.

b7C [redacted] stated that when he killed people on his own and not at a ceremony he was required to bring back something from the dead person such as some identification, clothing, jewelery, etc. If there was not a meeting of the cult in the near future, he was told to put these items beside a particular garbage can, light post, etc. and in a plastic bag or paper bag so that a member of the cult could verify his kill. [redacted] again stated that he "reckoned that they kept pretty good track of their people" and would know where and when to pick up the dead person's belongings. [redacted] related that he did not always comply since he sometimes sold the belongings of this victims and on several occasions at a cult meeting he was asked by other members why he had been selling his victim's belongings as if they were watching him and knew what he had been doing.

[redacted] stated that he did not know the names of any of the individuals in the group since they did not use names other than [redacted] described above.

[redacted] added that after he killed his victims he was required to have sex with the dead person as part of the ritual and on occasion he killed his victims while he was having sex with them, both men and women. [redacted] stated that he usually chopped the victims up afterwards as part of his witchcraft and devil worship routine since that would give him more of the devils's spirit. In addition, [redacted] related that he usually drank the blood of his victims. [redacted] added that he sometimes killed animals but when he killed people on his own he was not required to kill animals either before or afterward or part of the ritual.

[redacted] stated that he killed people in a large number of the states of the union and in different ways so that law enforcement officials could not catch on to what was going on. [redacted] added that he burned several of his victims after killing them since "fires excite him". [redacted] added that he had been setting fires since he was

LUCAS indicated that he understood the purpose of the interview as well as his rights and that he would be willing to answer questions without his attorney present:

LUCAS advised that he first became acquainted with the Satanic cult group known as "Hands of Death" in 1978 while he was traveling from Maryland enroute to California with his [redacted] LUCAS stated that they were in Maryland waiting to cross a bridge which was closed down. The traffic was stopped and a car pulled along side LUCAS' car. The driver of the other vehicle began talking to [redacted] and LUCAS and during the conversation LUCAS mentioned that he needed work. The other driver said that he wanted to talk more with LUCAS and would stop at a roadside park on the other side of the bridge once traffic started moving again.

LUCAS stated that after the other driver stopped he and [redacted] pulled into the roadside park and the other man, who identified himself as [redacted] said that he had work for LUCAS and asked LUCAS to accompany him to Shreveport, Louisiana. LUCAS agreed and left his [redacted] and drove to Shreveport with [redacted] in [redacted] s car. Once they arrived in Shreveport [redacted] told LUCAS that the job he had for him was to run stolen cars. LUCAS told [redacted] that he would not do so since he was involved in killing people and could not afford to be picked up by the police in a stolen car.

b7C

[redacted] told LUCAS that the fact that LUCAS was involved in killing people was just fine since he was a member of an organization that LUCAS could join which was known as the "Hands of Death". [redacted] explained to LUCAS that the organization was involved in rituals which were supposed to "reincarnate" the devil. These rituals involved killing people in different ways including crucifixions. LUCAS stated that he told [redacted] he could not join at that time since he had to return to Maryland to straighten out a few things but would return and speak to [redacted] about it at a later date. [redacted] told LUCAS to go to Miami, Florida instead as that was where [redacted] would be. [redacted] described for LUCAS a warehouse where he normally could be found during the day and told LUCAS to contact him there.

b7C LUCAS recalled that the warehouse was in the warehouse District of Miami and could be found by following the road which goes to the pier area of Miami. At a point where this road crosses a beach, the warehouse could be found by following the beach south to the third warehouse on the right-hand side. LUCAS stated that there are two roads going to the pier area in Miami, one going to an island and the other not going to an island. LUCAS stated that the road which does not go to an island is the road that crosses the beach described above. LUCAS described the warehouse as an old one which stores different types of equipment to be shipped over seas. LUCAS said that some stolen merchandise is also handled through the warehouse by [redacted]. LUCAS added that he believes that the road going to the pier area that he described above is the first road that crosses the Everglades once you arrive in Miami but that it should be followed east towards the ocean.

b7C LUCAS advised that he returned to Maryland and remained there for the rest of 1978. He had an argument with his sister sometime in February of 1979 and he departed Maryland in his sister's pick-up and drove to Florida. He contacted [redacted] in Jacksonville Florida and took him to Miami where they met [redacted] in his warehouse. [redacted] talked to both [redacted] and LUCAS about joining the "Hands of Death" and told them that they would have to go into the Everglades to be trained.

b7C LUCAS stated that [redacted] took them to a campsite inside the Everglades which could be reached by traveling to the first road crossing the Everglades north of Miami which is a turnpike or some similar road. Go another two miles north of this road on the north/south turnpike and there is a pier area off the side of the road. LUCAS stated that when they arrived at the pier area they were loaded into an airboat and taken for approximately a one half hour ride to an island inside the Everglades. LUCAS stated that the campsite there was camouflaged in that the buildings were built out of old trees which blended with the scenery. When he arrived, LUCAS observed approximately 100 people in the campsite taking different types of training. During the six weeks [redacted] and LUCAS spent at the campsite, many people came and went and during the period LUCAS estimated that there were probably 1000 people in and out of the campsite. LUCAS stated that some were being trained, some were getting different kinds of equipment and some were "reporting" on murders they had committed.

LUCAS stated that when he first arrived at the campsite he was tested as are all new members of the organization. The test consisted of having to kill someone who is stripped naked in front of the person being tested. The person being tested is told how they should kill

the victim. LUCAS stated that he was asked to kill a white male approximately twenty years old who had been a member of the organization and apparently had not done as he was told. LUCAS was told to kill him by shooting him and then cutting up his body on a sort of altar which was there. The altar consisted of a flat rock in the shape of a table top supported by rock pillars. LUCAS stated that he killed the man and cut him up after which some of the man's body parts were taken and eaten by people who were there. LUCAS added that [redacted] ate some of the body parts and assisted LUCAS in killing the man and cutting him up. LUCAS refused to eat any of the body parts and never has indulged in that kind of activity. LUCAS advised that he did not think that [redacted] had ever had any knowledge of this organization prior to their going to the campsite in 1979; however, [redacted] recently told LUCAS that he knew all about the cult long before LUCAS did but never told LUCAS before now.

b7C

LUCAS advised that the training they were given consisted of classes on the types of evidence police look for in murders and how to avoid leaving evidence such as fingerprints. LUCAS added that they were told that if they ever shot someone they would have to have the gun rebores so that no one could tell that it was the murder weapon. They were also told how to enter homes to murder but make the break-in look like it was a common burglary. They were also instructed as to how bodies should be transported without being noticed and how to communicate with other members without detection. When asked how this was done, LUCAS only replied that he was instructed to memorize the faces of the other members so that they would recognize one another when they met in different parts of the country. LUCAS added that when he met another member he would engage the member in a discussion about certain aspects of the cult as well as the places of previous meetings in order to see if the other member really knew the organization and was a member in fact. LUCAS stated that after the training period he and [redacted] were told to commit two killings per week and to kill animals along with the victims. They were also told to mutilate the human bodies and if they could not then they were to mutilate the animal body so as to transfer the human spirit into the animal and thereafter into the devil. LUCAS estimated that he has killed just as many animals as humans.

LUCAS stated that he and [redacted] returned to the Everglades campsite every month for about four months following their initial training and each time they were picked up at the roadside pier described above and taken in an airboat to the campsite then returned after they reported where their victims were hidden and how they had been killed and mutilated. After about four months, [redacted] told them that they had done such a good job that they only had to return once a year. [redacted]

added that if they ever picked up any merchandise they wanted to get rid of, they should take it to his warehouse in Miami and the money obtained from the sale of the merchandise would go to the "Hands of Death" organization.

LUCAS stated that members can also recognize one another by a tattoo that they should have on their right hand in the web between the thumb and forefinger. LUCAS stated that tattoo is of a cross, flames and hands. LUCAS added that some members have the tattoo of a snake and others the tattoo of a scorpion. He said that the individuals with tattoos of the hands, cross and flames were people who "go on the road to kill, committing burglaries, robberies, etc.". The people who have the tattoo of a snake are kidnapers and the people with the tattoo of a scorpion are ritual killers who kill for the ceremonies the cult engages in. LUCAS displayed his tattoo and said that it was nearly worn off. By observation it was determined that there is no tattoo in the web of his right hand between the thumb and forefinger but there are some very faint dark lines whose shape could not be discerned.

b7C LUCAS advised that he was given specific assignments by [redacted] on behalf of the cult on occasion. Once [redacted] called LUCAS from San Antonio, Texas and asked LUCAS to travel from Maryland to San Antonio since he had an assignment to kill two millionaires in Bastrop, Texas. LUCAS traveled to San Antonio and met [redacted] and they traveled to the home of the two millionaires. LUCAS said that he waited outside while [redacted] killed the man and his wife after which they loaded their bodies in a van and LUCAS and [redacted] drove to Reno, Nevada where they dumped the bodies in the desert nearby. LUCAS advised that an unknown lady in Houston, Texas had hired the "Hands of Death" to commit the killings and the assignment had been given to [redacted]. LUCAS said that he and [redacted] got \$5,000 each for the murder. LUCAS used his \$5,000 to purchase a travel trailer.

LUCAS advised that he has attended meetings of the cult irregularly and the last meeting he attended was in 1981 in the Everglades. Some of the meetings were held on a deserted beach just south of Fort Lauderdale, Florida. These meetings are held once a year during June or July and sometimes 75-100 people would attend although they usually broke up into smaller groups of 20 or so so as not to attract attention. The parties usually consist of worship services where they pray to the devil, and dances, sex and narcotics. LUCAS recalled that once they were checked out by the local police but since they were doing nothing wrong the police left them alone. LUCAS said that there were no murders committed on the beach during these parties since they could not hide the bodies that well. He said that the murders

were usually committed in the Everglades where they could easily dump the bodies.

LUCAS added that he has attended meetings outside of Florida in Indiana (twice) at a campsite near a river. LUCAS stated that this campsite could be located by traveling east of Indianapolis on a highway (possibly Highway 41) about twelve to fourteen miles to a river. Once arriving at the river, one could travel south of the bridge along the riverbank a short distance and the campsite could be located there.

b7C LUCAS also stated that he received an assignment once from [redacted] to kill President CARTER. This assignment was given in 1979 and LUCAS followed CARTER to several different locations in Washington, D.C. and once to Palm Springs, California but did not kill CARTER although he had several opportunities to shoot him. LUCAS understood that he was given the assignment because of various laws that were being passed that the "Hands of Death" organization did not want passed.

LUCAS also said that the death squads in El Salvador are being set up by the "Hands of Death" organization out of Miami. When asked how he knew this, LUCAS replied that he knows because they are being set up out of Miami and guns are being sent to the death squads from Miami. LUCAS said that the death squads have been in existence long before the United States was aware of it and that he once was even asked to go to El Salvador to join the squads and kill people. LUCAS said that he refused but did take assignments to go to Spain and Canada where he committed some killings.

b7C LUCAS said that he killed a high ranking civilian in Spain in May of 1979 after having been given the assignment by the cult. [redacted] only told him to kill but gave him no reason and LUCAS traveled to Spain and shot the man. Two months before that, LUCAS said that he and [redacted] traveled to Spain and killed an entire family as this was [redacted] assignment from the cult. LUCAS said that he and [redacted] traveled to Spain on a boat and got their passports in Jacksonville, Florida. Later, in 1980 or 1981, he traveled to Canada and killed six to eight people including some businessmen as an assignment from the cult.

b7C LUCAS added that he has also been involved in a lot of kidnappings in which he has kidnaped people "to order". LUCAS explained that he was told by [redacted] to kidnap a person of a specific age, height, weight, hair color and take them through El Paso to a location outside of Monterey, Mexico. LUCAS said that children were sometimes kidnaped and taken to Mexico for adoption purposes and older women were kidnaped

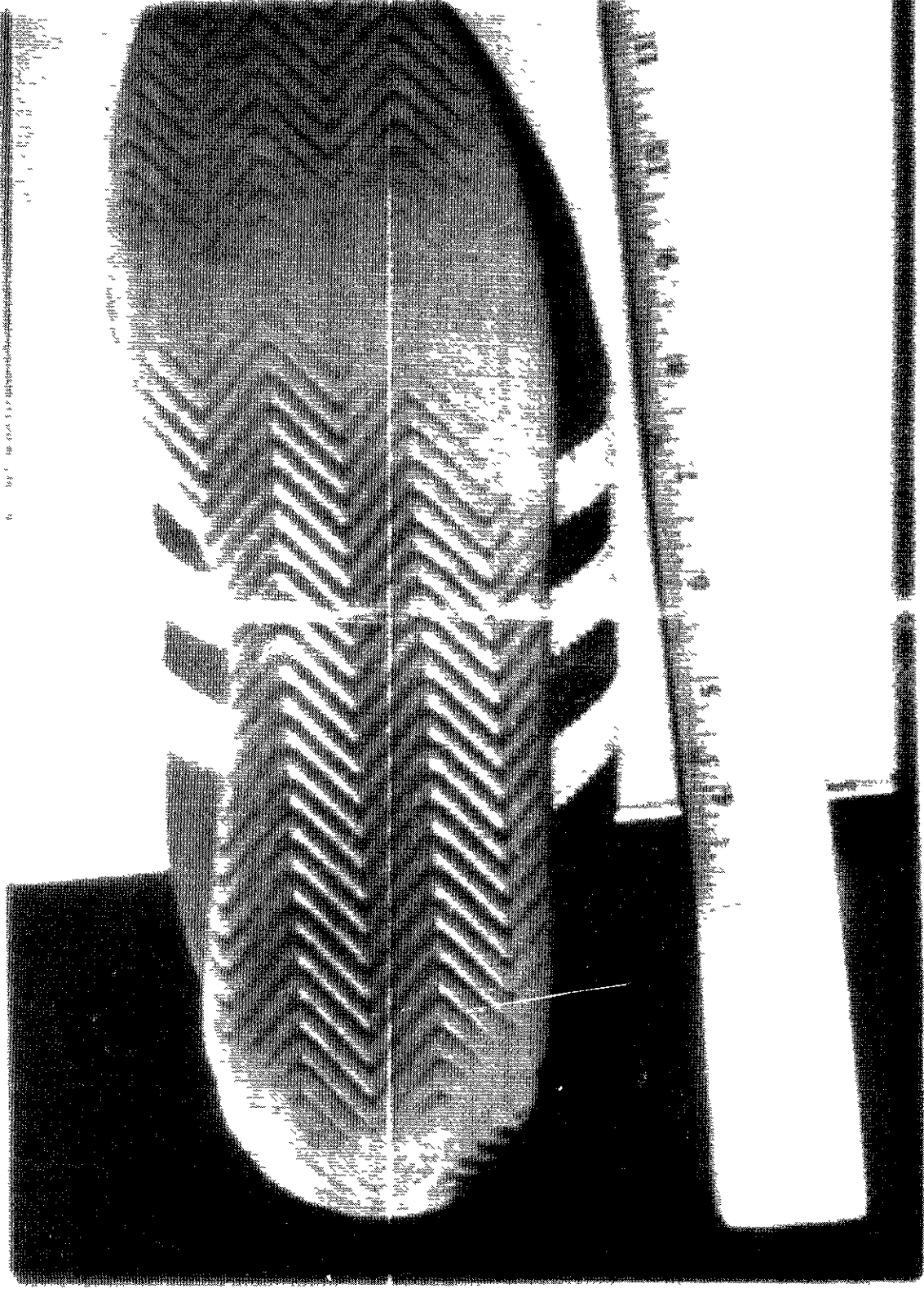

The enclosed letter, and an identical copy addressed to the El Paso SAC, were received by the El Paso Office on 2/11/86. The letter is an admonition by El Paso Attorney ARVEL R. PONTON, III, against any contact of his client, HENRY LEE LUCAS, by any law enforcement officers. LUCAS is awaiting trial in El Paso on capital murder charges. He has received national publicity by initially confessing to scores of murders across the country, and subsequently recanting many of these confessions. Because of the publicity surrounding this matter, and inasmuch as the letter is addressed to the Director, it is being forwarded to the Bureau for information purposes.

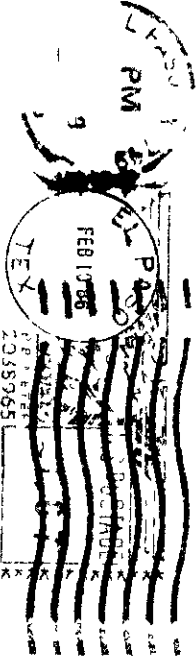
